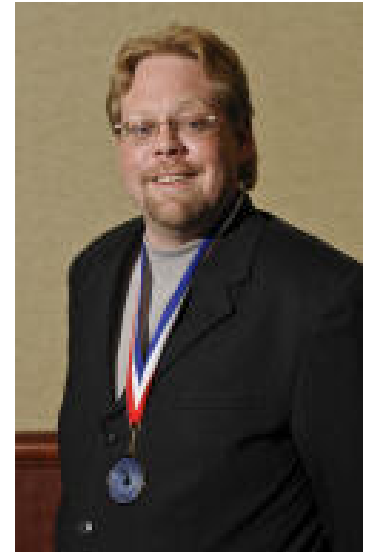
International Academic Society honors Chris Woodruff

LANSING---Christopher Woodruff, Vice President of the Phi Theta Kappa International Honor Society chapter at Glen Oaks Community College, received honors in Lansing on March 25th as a member of the All-Michigan Academic Team. The Michigan Community College Association (MCCA) honored Woodruff, of White Pigeon, and students from 24 other community colleges based on their academic achievement, community service involvement and leadership accomplishments. A total of 46 students received the honor.

Phi Theta Kappa is headquartered in Jackson, MS, and is the largest honor society in America higher education with 1,250 chapters

at two-year and community college campuses in all the 50 United States, Canada, Germany, the Republic of Palau, Republic of the Marshall Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, the British Virgin Islands, the United Arab Emirates and U.S. territorial possessions. More than two million students have been inducted in the organization since its founding in 1918, with approximately 100,000 students inducted each year.

Glen Oaks Community College has 69 members in the Alpha Delta Omega Chapter of Phi Theta Kappa. Students must maintain a 3.3 grade point average to become a member.
