The 2011-2012 Presidential Scholarship

A Scholarship worth up to \$8000!!

Purpose: The Presidential Scholarship is an opportunity for the area's top high school graduates to pursue their first two years of college while saving \$4000 each year in tuition and fees.

Terms of Scholarship: The Scholarship will cover the first \$4000 of education related expenses each year. Student must enroll full-time (12+ credits) each semester. The scholarship will be renewed for a second award year if the student maintains a 3.5 GPA while at Glen Oaks.

Minimum qualifications to apply:

- Graduating high school class of 2011
- Minimum 3.5 Cumulative GPA through the end of their 1st semester or 2nd trimester of 12th grade
- SAT of 1110+, OR ACT of 24+, OR member of NHS, OR top 10% of class

Application Deadline:

The Glen Oaks Financial Aid Office must receive **all** materials by **4 pm, Monday, March 14, 2011**. (No exceptions)

Application process:

1. Complete and submit the [Presidential & Dean's Scholarship Application](#)
2. Submit a required short essay: **Describe your future goals and how attending Glen Oaks Community College would be a stepping stone for attaining those goals.** (No more than one page)
3. Submit an official high school transcript.
4. Submit an application for admission to Glen Oaks Community College (available on line at www.glenoaks.edu).
5. Submit test results from ACT or SAT or ACCUPLACER Course Placement Evaluation.

NOTE: To take the Glen Oaks Community College ACCUPLACER Assessment Evaluation. Testing is available hourly Mon. through Thurs. 8:30am - 5:30pm and hourly Fri. 8:30am - 1:30pm. Students will need to reserve a seat for one of these testing times by contacting the Testing and Tutoring Center at 294-4270.

Qualifying applicants will be contacted to schedule an interview. Interviews will take place mid to late March. Those selected to receive the scholarship will be notified in April.

Presidential scholarship recipients will be expected to serve as a goodwill ambassador. Time commitment may vary but expected 2-3 hours per semester.
