

The TRiO Pipeline

TRiO programs were established during the mid-1960s as a national educational initiative to increase the availability to and success in post-secondary education for disadvantaged and traditionally under-served students. These programs are funded through the 1965 Higher Education Act under Title IV.



Postsecondary

Ronald E. McNair Program
 Graduate school preparatory program for students from low-income, first-generation and underrepresented backgrounds. Prepares students for doctoral study and careers in the professoriate.

 Helps low income and first generation college students and individuals with disabilities graduate from college.

Educational Talent Search
 Identifies, prepares and assists individuals ages 11-27 with applying for financial aid and college admission.

Upward Bound
 Prepares high school students for success in post secondary education.

Upward Bound Math/Science
 Prepares high school students for college programs that lead to careers in math and science.

Veterans Upward Bound
 Provides educational and support services to enable veterans to make the transition to postsecondary education.

Educational Opportunity Centers
 Helps adults gain admission to college and find financial assistance for their education.
